Dearly Beloved Members of the Ukrainian Orthodox League of the USA:
GLORY TO JESUS CHRIST!

"In the beginning..." our Holy Ukrainian Orthodox Church was blessed with a visionary leader and Spiritual Father in the person of Archbishop John (Theodorovych). He was a very charismatic leader whose entire life consisted of his loving service to the souls entrusted to his spiritual care. He arrived in the USA in 1924 and from the moment his feet touched the ground, it was his home. He had a very full and productive life in Ukraine as a leading Archbishop there and he could have lived his life here in the USA longing for the "good old days back home" with millions of faithful, thousands of parishes and abundant numbers of brother hierarchs upon whom he could rely for spiritual comfort, healing and nourishment. He deliberately committed himself, however, to his tiny new flock, "dedicating himself to his Church and devoting himself to her youth", long before the Ukrainian Orthodox League adopted these words as its life-long motto.

From 1924 to 1947 Archbishop John built up the American-Ukrainian Orthodox Church, as we were known in the early days into a thriving witness for Christ our Lord. He mastered the English language and paid special attention to the youth of each parish he visited. They flocked around him in the parish halls after Liturgy and he told them all to call him "Grandpa" ... and they loved it. These children had wonderful memories of these meetings all through their adult lives.

Archbishop John understood the importance of relating with the youth of his Church and the profound consequences of doing so. Those young people were the very ones he invited to an exploratory conference in 1947 to consider the possibility of establishing a youth-oriented organization, which would serve a somewhat of a first "Youth Ministry" of the Church. This meeting concluded with the appointment of a committee to plan for this ministry and after many months of study and hard work, they presented a plan to His Eminence and the First Official Convention of the Ukrainian Orthodox League was convened in 1948. So, in reality, the 75th anniversary we celebrate in 2022 is really that of the decision to establish the League and we are participants of the 74th Annual Convention. The tradition was, however, "From the beginning..." to consider that first exploratory conference as the first "convening" of the youth leaders of our Holy Ukrainian Orthodox Church and hence identified as our First Annual Convention.

Disregarding the circumstances of today's UOL membership, which is comparable to the circumstances in most Christian communities - Orthodox or not - the UOL has always played a pivotal role in our Church life. As those youth leaders of 1947 matured and began questioning their "right" to be considered the youth of the Church, they decided in the early 1960's to establish their "right" to be considered the youth of the Church, to prepare future leaders for the League, parish communities and the national administrative bodies of the Church. At some of the most difficult moments of the position of the Ukrainian Orthodox League was paramount in the resolution of the Holy Ukrainian Orthodox Church and hence identified as our First Annual Convention.
